Calling positions for the Tenor

Calling positions for the Tenor in Minor				
5-6 Down	Home	(Right)		
5-6 Up Wrong				
Run In	In			
Run Out	Before	(Out)		
Make the Bob Fourths (Make)				



Where to make the Calls

Bobs and Singles are called one whole pull before they take effect on the treble's backstroke in second's place before the full lead

Run Out Call bob on your backstroke lead

Run In Call bob on your first backstroke in 4th's

Make Bob Call bob on your backstroke in 3rd's

5-6 Up Call bob on backstroke 5th's before dodge

5-6 Down Call bob on backstroke 6th's before dodge



Bobs and Singles - Called at 'W'

BOB

- 3 Runs Out
- 2 Runs In
- 5 Makes 4ths

SINGLE

- 3 Makes 2nds (unaffected)
- 2 Makes 3rds
- 5 Makes 4ths

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
Bobs and Singles - Called at 'H'


BOB

- 2 Runs Out
- 4 Runs In
- 3 Makes 4ths

SINGLE

- 2 Makes 2nds (unaffected)
- 4 Makes 3rds
- 3 Makes 4ths

Diary Touch a)

Every Lead End is included

Rows with a -= Bob

Rows with an S = Single

Other Rows are Plain Leads

Follow the path of the 2nd

Work out what it is doing at the calls.

In, 4ths, H, 3rds Out, W, 4ths, 2nds

Diary Touch b)

Shows only where the calls are made and the Course Ends which they produce.

The Touch is Four Courses long.

It is a good shorthand way of recording what is called and very useful for experienced conductors.

Diary Touch c)

Tells you how many leads there are between calls.

Essential to count accurately.

Possible to work out calling from any bell but should write out both parts in full.


Why are touches always written to be called from the Tenor?

It is usual to write them this way

Any touch can be written out and the calling worked out for any bell



The Plain Course with Calling Positions for 2nd





Choosing Touches

- What is the purpose of a touch?
- Service? Good ringing a priority
- Learner? Complexity important
- Time?
- Plain Course = 60 changes
- 4 or 5 minutes for 120 changes




Callings for any bell

- 3 Bobs at Home from other than Tenor
- 3 Bobs at Wrong from other than Tenor
- 2 Singles at Home from other than the Tenor



3 Bobs at Home from other than Tenor

- Choose to ring 2nd
- Call a Bob each time you dodge at 'Home' (3 times)
- This is at the second lead end of each course
- 3 Course Touch
- 180 Changes





Calling the previous touch from the 3rd

First Bob 3 runs In

Second Bob 3 runs Out

Third Bob 3 Makes

Remember it as I O M

Or as Isle Of Man


Can also call MIO or OMI

123456



3 Bobs at Wrong from other than Tenor

- Choose to ring 3rd
- Call a Bob each time you dodge at 'Wrong' (3 times)
- This is at the fourth lead end of each course
- 3 Course Touch
- 180 Changes





2 Singles at Home (for the Tenor) from another bell

Choose to ring 3rd

Call yourself to make Fourths

Call yourself to make Thirds

That's All!



A Popular short Touch

- Two courses are frequently requested at practices and meetings
- Call Tenor W H W H
- Any other bell, call H W H W



Making up short Touches

- Hs Hs or Ws Ws = 120
- 3x H or 3x W = 180
- H Hs H Hs = 240



Using Coursing Order

- What is the Order of passing bells in the Plain Course
- How do Bobs and Singles affect the order
- We will take a quick look at using Coursing Order for Conducting and Correcting



Order of passing bells in the Plain Course

Order often written 65324 – order from the Tenor

It could be 24653 – order from 2nd

Or

It could be 32465 – order from 3rd

Treble is ignored because it changes place each lead



How do Bobs at H affect the order?

Ringing the Tenor

Write the order as 3246532

Bob at H will affect 324

2 Runs OUT, 4 Runs In, 3 Makes 4ths

New order is 24365

We transpose 3 numbers

ABC becomes BCA



How do Bobs at W affect the order?

Ringing the Tenor

Write the order as 3246532

Bob at W will affect 532

3 Runs OUT, 2 Runs In, 5 Makes 4ths

New order is 46325

We transpose 3 numbers

ABC becomes BCA



How do Singles affect the order?

We know that Singles affect 2 bells

Call Single at H for Tenor

3246532 becomes 42365

Transposition is ABC to CBA

A makes 4ths

C makes 3rds

B makes 2nds (unaffected)



A Practice at Transposing Coursing Order

What are the orders for the following touch?

H Hs H Hs

Remember

Bob ABC to BCA

Single ABC to CBA

<u>32465</u>

24365 H

34265 Hs

42365 H

32465 Hs



Coursing orders for the earlier examples

A = 3x H called from 2nd

B= 3x W called from 3rd
