- 6. Reports for the last year
  - a. Accounts (2021)

The income and outgoings were straightforward with the only expenditure of note being the purchase of the eBells.

also reported that he was still aiming to get online banking for the account, that he wanted to open a savings account where we could earn some interest on our money and that he also planned to get another signatory for the account.

It was suggested that he talk to **Exercise** as she has arranged online banking for the Leeds Minster account, and since they had some direct debits set up, the account was free.

The accounts were proposed by All in favour.

#### b. Secretary

The report had been circulated at the meeting; this was a record of ringing in the branch in the last year and would be printed in the annual report.

said that she had omitted to mention that Kirkby Overblow had been augmented from 3 to 4 bells during 2021 and a new band was now being trained there, and would add that to the report.

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She also mentioned the eBells which the branch had purchased in the last year, together with a book that teaches you how to ring handbells. If anyone was thinking of learning to ring handbells they would find these very useful. The eBells are available for branch members to borrow, as are two DVD's - "Come on. Listen to it" and "From Rounds to Ropesight", both from the Whiting Society.

c. Ringing Master

reported that Covid restrictions had been lifted in July and we had been able to hold our first branch practice in August, and it was good to see so many people turning up. There had been good turnouts since, particularly at Leeds Minster where it was really encouraging to see so many new people.

We had been experimenting in the last couple of months. We plan to continue with the two towers – please let us know if you don't find Bob Doubles useful and there is something else that you'd like us to ring.

thanked towers for allowing us to ring, in particular tower captains for their work behind the scenes ensuring that we complied with regulations.

7. Safeguarding

The branch is arranging a safeguarding training course for tower captains, deputy tower captains and significant youth trainers. This is a bespoke course arranged especially for bellringers and will be face to face. (Diocesan Safeguarding Trainer) and (YACR Safeguarding Officer) are carrying out the training. The YACR wants all tower captains to do the course, and we are taking names now so that we can take account of your availability and can try and set a date that suits everyone.

There are also online training courses; Basic Awareness and Foundations (these replace the old C0 and C1 courses). It is recommended that all ringers should do the Basic Awareness course and Tower Captains etc should do both courses before attending the face to face training.

With all the courses you should refresh your training after 3 years.
