RULES OF THE ASSOCIATION

I NAME AND OBJECTS

This Society shall be named "The Yorkshire Association of Change Ringers". Its objects shall be:

- 1. To promote ringing for divine service and to secure recognition of ringers as church workers.
- 2. To cultivate the art of change ringing and encourage recruitment and the instruction of ringers.
- 3. To promote good fellowship amongst ringers and bring all ringers into a closer friendship.
- 4. To endeavour to arrange instruction for bands of ringers desiring it.
- To obtain the co-operation of church authorities in the maintenance of bells and ringing rooms in proper condition.

II MEMBERS SUBSCRIPTIONS

The Association shall consist of Qualified. Associate, Non-Resident and Life members. The amount of subscriptions for subsequent years for each of these shall be decided at an Annual General Meeting and stated in a schedule to the Rules. A proportion of the subscriptions of members shall be allocated to the Bell Repair Fund. Annual subscriptions are due on the 1st January. All new members shall be supplied with an Association badge. Qualified and Associate members shall be supplied with their appropriate cards of membership.

III ORGANISATION AND GOVERNMENT

Within the general framework of the Association there shall be Branches.

The General Officers shall be a President, General Secretary, Treasurer, Peal Secretary, Report Editor, Composition Secretary, Ringing Master and Librarian.

Branch Officers shall be Chairmen (one from each Branch), Branch Secretaries and Ringing Masters. The General Committee shall consist of the General Officers, the Vice-Presidents, the Central Council

Representatives and two members from each of the Branch Committees. It shall have control over the funds of the Association.

There shall be a standing sub-committee consisting of the President, General Secretary, one other General Officer chosen by the President and one representative from each of the Branch Committees. The Branch Representatives shall be nominated by their respective Chairmen. Branch Committees shall consist of the Branch officers and other members.

There shall be an Education Committee. It shall consist of one representative from each Branch, not necessarily a General Committee member, and shall elect its own convenor who shall be ex-officio on the General Committee. It shall meet at least once a year and shall have the power to co-opt.

There shall be an Association Librarian/Archivist.

There shall be a Gift Aid Officer. He/she shall be appointed annually by the General Committee and to that Committee, if not otherwise a member of it.

There shall be an Association Membership Manager. He/she shall be appointed annually by the General Committee and to that Committee, if not otherwise a member of it.

There shall be a Webmaster. He/she shall be appointed every three years by the General Committee and to that Committee, if not otherwise a member of it.

There shall be a Safeguarding Officer. He/she shall be appointed annually by the General Committee and to that Committee, if not otherwise a member of it.

There shall be an Association Public Relations Officer. He/she shall be appointed annually by the General Committee and to that Committee, if not otherwise a member of it.

There shall be a Bell Repair Fund Committee consisting of a maximum of twenty members including the five Custodian Trustees of the Bell Repair Fund.

There shall be a Young Ringers' group.

IV VICE PRESIDENTS

The title "Vice President" can be conferred as a mark of distinction on any person the Association wishes to honour.

V ANNUAL REPORT

The Association will publish an Annual Report.

VI INDEPENDENT EXAMINERS

Two members shall be appointed at the Annual General Meeting to independently examine the accounts of the Association.

VII THE GENERAL MEETINGS

The Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held on the first Saturday in May following the May Day Bank Holiday, in each Branch in rotation if possible. Two General Meetings shall be held during the year in addition, normally on the first Saturday in February and the third Saturday in September.

VIII BELL REPAIR FUND

There shall be a Bell Repair Fund.

IX CENTRAL COUNCIL OF CHURCH BELLRINGERS.

The Association shall be affiliated to this Council and shall abide by its rules and decisions.

X ALTERATION TO RULES

No alteration or addition to these Rules or Standing Orders shall be made except at one of the three General Meetings. Particulars of a proposed alteration or addition shall be notified in writing to the Secretary, placed on the agenda and announced at a General Meeting. The proposition shall not be put to the vote until the meeting following the announcement.

STANDING ORDERS OF THE ASSOCIATION

A MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS

- To be eligible for election to the status of Qualified Member a ringer shall have rung to a method either.
 - a) on tower bells 720 changes on either a working bell or the treble; or the tenor covering to 1260 changes; or
 - b) 720 changes on a pair of handbells.
- 2. Associate Members are those ringers who have not yet qualified for (1) above.
- 3. Qualified and Associate Members may apply to the General Committee for Life Membership on reaching the age of 65 years, if they have held continuous paid annual membership, either as an Associate Member or Qualified Member of the Association, for the last 30 years. Life Members may hold office and vote on all matters. Applications shall be made in writing to the General Secretary by the 31 December.
- 4. Life Membership may be granted by the General Committee to others at their discretion, particularly to those who have rendered outstanding service to the Association and to those who are unable to continue active ringing. Life Members may hold office and vote on all matters. Applications shall be made in writing to the General Secretary by the 31 December.
- Qualified and Associate Members are entitled to the Report of the previous year and to vote for the election of officers when they have paid their subscription for the current financial year.
- 6. Ringers who are neither resident in the County nor attached to any tower in the County may become Non-Resident Members. Non-Resident Members are not eligible for election to official positions in the Association and do not have a vote at elections. (For exception see 8 below). They do not receive reports and notices issued by the Association.
- 7. A Member may leave the County but wish to continue his membership; if he has paid two or more Annual Subscriptions he is eligible to become a Non-Resident Member without any further payment. The change may be made by application to his Branch Secretary.
- 8. An election may be made before a peal attempt providing there are three or more members of the Association in the band and all of them agree to it. Non-Resident Members are eligible to vote only at such an election.

B GENERAL COMMITTEE

A quorum of seven shall be competent to transact the business of the General Committee.

C BUSINESS AT GENERAL MEETINGS

A proposition dealing with the funds of the Association shall only be put to the vote at a General Meeting. A notice of the intention to move such a resolution shall be given at a previous General Meeting unless such a proposition has been recommended by the General Committee.

D ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- The General Officers shall hold office for three years: the President and Peal Secretary being elected for one year; the Treasurer, Report Editor and Librarian the next: the General Secretary, Composition Secretary and Ringing Master the year after that. All retiring officers shall be eligible for re-election. except that the President shall not be eligible for election for more than two consecutive terms of office.
- Candidates for the position of President, Secretary. Treasurer, Peal Secretary, Report Editor, Composition Secretary, Ringing Master and Librarian may be either:
 - a) nominated by a proposer and seconder at the General Meeting preceding the Annual General Meeting, or
 - b) nominated by a proposer and seconder in writing to the General Secretary on or before the last day of the month in which the said General Meeting has taken place.
- 3. An election shall be decided by a show of hands unless six or more members request a ballot.
- 4. In the event of a lie the election shall be deferred until the following General Meeting, the retiring officer carrying out his duties until that date. If the retiring officer is unable to do so, the President shall nominate a person to the office until the next meeting.
- 5. In the event of a General Officer resigning before the expiration of his full term of office, notice of the General Officer's resignation shall be given at the next General Meeting of the Association. Candidates for election to the resigning General Officer's position may be:
 - a) nominated by a proposer and a seconder at the General Meeting at which the General Officer's resignation is announced; or
 - b) nominated by a proposer and a seconder in writing to the General Secretary on or before the last day of the month following the month in which the General Meeting took place at which the General Officer's resignation was announced.
- The election to fill the vacancy outlined in Standing Order D5 shall take place at the next General Meeting of the Association. Such a General Meeting need not be the Annual General Meeting of the Association.
- In the event of the resigning officer being unable to carry out his duties until a successor has been elected, the President of the Association may, after consultation with other General Officers:
 - a) nominate a person to the office until a successor has been elected, or
 - b) take such steps, if any, as he thinks fit.
- 8. Any General Officer elected pursuant to Standing Order D5 and D6 shall hold office only for the length of the unexpired term of the General Officer who has resigned.

E VICE PRESIDENTS

Any nomination shall, in the first place, be made in writing to the General Secretary. It must have the approval of the General Committee before being submitted to a General Meeting for voting.

F MANAGEMENT OF BRANCHES

- Each Branch shall be managed by a Committee which includes the Chairman. Ringing Master, Branch Secretary and/or Treasurer. Two members of this Committee shall be on the General Committee. All members of the Committee shall reside or ring within their Branch.
- At any Branch meeting only members resident or ringing in that Branch shall be entitled to vote at elections.
- The Branch Secretaries shall collect and forward to the Association Treasurer the subscriptions of members in their respective Branches and give them their Reports, cards of membership and badges. Receipt books shall be sent to the Association Treasurer by mid December.

- 4. Branches shall be entitled to hold and manage their own funds out of which all administrative expenses of the Branch are to be paid. After the Annual General Meeting each year the Association Treasurer shall forward to the Branch Secretary a grant to cover the year's expenses. At the Annual General Meeting each year the amount of the grant for the following year shall be decided.
- Branches shall produce accounts each year which shall be independently examined and sent to the Association Treasurer for publication in the Annual Report.
- An account of the year's work in the Branch shall be sent to the Report Editor by 31st December for the Report.
- 7. The name, tower and address of all resident members of the Association shall be sent to the Association Membership Manager immediately after the meeting at which they were elected.

G CENTRAL COUNCIL REPRESENTATIVES

- Nominations shall be made at the May meeting a year before the new Council meets, or in writing to the General Secretary before the end of May, and the election shall be held at the following September meeting.
- Casual vacancies shall be filled by nomination and election at the next General Meeting after the vacancy occurs.
- 3. Representatives attending meetings of the Council shall be entitled to reimbursement of costs up to the maximum stated in the Schedule.

H BELL REPAIR FUND

- 1. Collections for this may be taken at any meeting and the amount of the collection announced.
- The Bell Repair Fund Committee shall be responsible for the administration of the Bell Repair Fund.
- 3. The Bell Repair Fund Committee shall, each year, appoint a member of the Association to produce an annual Friends of the Bell Fund Report.
- 4. A quorum of seven shall be competent to transact the business of the Bell Repair Fund Committee.

I PEALS

- Peals shall be recorded providing that all those taking part are Qualified, Life or Non-Resident Members of the Association.
- 2. Conductors shall forward the following to the Peal Secretary:
 - a) details of the performance written out in the same way as in the Report on one side only of the paper;
 - b) the names of the towers to which the ringers belong and an indication of Non-Resident Members:
 - c) the names, addresses and subscriptions of any ringers elected immediately before the peal:
 - d) the peal booking fee as stated in the schedule;
 - e) the composition or its peal number in the Association's Reports.
- 3. These details shall be forwarded to the Peal Secretary within one month of the performance. No peal shall be accepted if reported more than two months after its performance, except that details of all peals rung in December must reach the Peal Secretary by the 31st January at the latest. The power to accept or reject a peal shall be vested in the General Committee.

J ASSOCIATION LIBRARY/ARCHIVE

The Association's Library/Archive shall be housed in The Old Palace near York Minster. The Association Librarian/Archivist shall be authorised to spend an amount up to the limit stated in the Schedule for the administration of the Association Library/Archive.

K EDUCATION COMMITTEE

The Education Committee shall be entitled to hold and manage its own funds out of which all
administrative expenses of the committee are to be paid. After the Annual General Meeting
each year the Association Treasurer shall forward to the Education Committee a grant to cover

- the year's expenses. At the Annual General Meeting each year the amount of the grant for the following year shall be decided and stated in the Schedule.
- The Education Committee shall produce accounts each year which shall be independently examined and shall be sent to the Association Treasurer for publication in the Annual Report.
- 3. An account of the year's work by the committee shall be sent to the Report Editor by 31st December for inclusion in the Report.

L YOUNG RINGERS' GROUP

- The Young Ringers' group shall be entitled to hold and manage its own funds out of which all
 administrative expenses of the group are to be paid. After the Annual General Meeting each
 year the Association Treasurer shall forward to the group a grant to cover the year's expenses.
 At the Annual General Meeting each year the amount of the grant for the following year shall
 be decided and stated in the Schedule.
- The Young Ringers' group shall produce accounts each year which shall be independently examined and shall be sent to the Association Treasurer for publication in the Annual Report.
- 3. An account of the year's work by the group shall be sent to the Report Editor by 31st December for inclusion in the Report.
- 4. Membership will be open to all resident ringers under 19 years of age.
- The group shall be managed by a Committee which includes a Chairman. Ringing Master, Secretary and Treasurer.
- 6. At any group meeting only members of that group shall be entitled to vote at elections.

SCHEDULE TO THE RULES

- 1. The annual subscription for Qualified and Associate Members and the subscription for Non-Resident Members shall be £12.00, except for those under 17 years of age or in full-time education, for whom the subscriptions shall be £6.00. Life members are not required to pay an annual subscription.
- 2. 40% of all subscriptions shall be paid into the Bell Repair Fund.
- 3. Branch grants shall be 15% of annual subscriptions (excluding Non-Resident Members' subscriptions) received in the previous year but not exceeding an amount equal to the branch expenditure during the previous year, less the cost of advertising in the Ringing World during the previous year. Applications for further funding shall be made to the General Officers of the Association.
- 4. Cost of badges: £3.50 each.
- 5. Cost of Reports to Non-Members: £4.00 each.
- 6. Peal Booking Fee: 50p per ringer; the whole of the peal booking fee collected shall be paid into the General Fund.
- Central Council Representatives: Maximum entitlement travelling expenses 20p per mile or standard class rail fare, subsistence £10.
- 8. The annual grant to the Education Committee shall be £500 less the cost of advertising in the Ringing World during the previous year.
- 9. The Librarian shall be authorised to spend up to £120 each year.
- 10. The annual grant to the Young Ringers shall be £500 for 2022.

RINGING MASTER'S REPORT

Ringing has slowly continued to return to normal following on from the easing of restrictions post Covid, with ringers far more at ease with being in close company of others. In May the Association was welcomed by the Western Branch who gave us an interesting mix of towers from the excellent 8 at Almondbury to the challenging 10 at Huddersfield where, by request, a half course of Bristol S. Royal was successfully rung, despite the swaying tower having other ideas. Once again Selby played host to a Rounds, Call Changes and Plain Hunt on 11 & 12 session. The ringing room was full of willing participants. 12 bell events especially show the need to have rock solid bell handling control with people being able to ring exactly in the right place, right tempo and speed. The more consistent their action in handling, the easier ringing should become and the more enjoyment the individual should gain from their ringing. A second Hat Contest was held at Thorner, where both novice and experienced ringers were mixed together to ring rounds and call changes. This once again proved to be a good ringing and social event especially as it was a lovely sunny day. The General meeting in the Cleveland & North Yorkshire branch saw no more than 30 people on the day. Stockton hosted the meeting and service where Grandsire Cinques was the method for the service touch. In the short service 11 of this band formed nearly half the congregation! Yorkshire has many challenging as well as easy going 'well behaved' rings of bells, be they short or long draught, guided or not, so the importance of good bell handling technique should not be underestimated to ring these bells well. Once again, my thanks go to all the people who have supported me during the last year and have hopefully enjoyed their ringing with me and will continue to do so. With what seems to be ever increasing parochial or cluster-based ringing, I hope ringers will still continue to travel to enjoy the company of others and to ring in different towers. whether for a first time 'grab' or simply to support the ringing of bells at meetings.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

This year has been a quiet one for the Library and Archive.

A number of things are in hand as listed below.

- 1) I have sought to obtain a quote for the restoration of one of our more significant manuscript books. This manuscript is a history of bell ringing in Yorkshire written in long hand by someone in the middle of the 19th Century. It is in poor condition and needs binding carefully to render it suitable for consultation.
- 2) I have agreed a timescale with the Minster Library for the removal of the physical copies of the Ringing World Collection, as agreed.
- 3) I am considering the future of the general ringing books stored in the public area of the Library. Information from the Librarian indicates that no one has consulted them for some time and they occupy a significant piece of prime shelf real estate in the Library.
- 4) I have yet to visit the Archive but will endeavour to do so shortly.
- 5) The collection of reports of the Association is significant and of course not available in digital form, unlike the Ringing World. I have received only one request for permission to look at the reports which has recently come in.

I am not aware of any other visit to the Collection by a member of the general public.

SAFEGUARDING OFFICER'S REPORT

It is pleasing to report that the Safeguarding Training Programme for Tower Captains & Deputies has moved forward with courses in Leeds & District and Western Branches taking place during the year. Steps had been taken to include Sheffield & District as well, but this could not be achieved within 2022 and remains a priority for 2023, along with those other Branches still outstanding. Both events were very well attended with very positive feedback in both cases.

I hosted The Safeguarding Workshop at the Grand Day Out on 2nd April 2022 in Harrogate. This focussed on compliance with the C of E Safer Recruitment requirements as outlined in the Safeguarding Statement, along with information about the recent Training Revisions.

I reporte that during 2022 it has been necessary for one ringer to be suspended from all ringing activities pending the conclusion of police investigation into serious allegations. Hopefully this will be resolved as soon as possible in 2023.

A further complaint was received about alleged incidents during a ringing tour of Yorkshire towers. Because the allegations relate to a privately organised event the Diocesan Authority involved has referred the case to The Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, and there remains some doubt about jurisdiction. The complainant has been advised to refer matters to police if legal redress should be the desired outcome.

It gives me great satisfaction to report that I was alerted to serious concerns about a vulnerable adult ringer who seemed to be undergoing mental health issues. In following up the report I was touched by the efforts of those ringers with knowledge of the individual, ensuring that wellbeing was assured with positive plans in hand to maintain future support.

After over twenty years in post, I have decided to stand down as Safeguarding Officer. During my tenure I have seen very positive changes in ringers' perceptions and willingness to learn and adapt. A potential successor has come forward, and so I leave the office with every confidence that the Association will remain guided and supported very ably in the future.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE REPORT

In this, my first report to the Yorkshire Association as Convenor of the Education Committee, I would like to provide an update on activities since taking on the role in October 2022.

Initial work to date has involved the setting up of Association of Ringing Teachers (ART) Module 1 courses to train people in teaching of bell handling. I firmly believe that this initiative will provide the Yorkshire Association with increased capacity to train beginners and will enable this important introductory work to be spread around, thus reducing strain on the existing teachers. It will also provide learners with choice in who teaches them to handle a tower bell. The Yorkshire Association is covering the course fees of its members to attend these courses. Please see the Education pages of the Yorkshire Association website or the ART website for further details. It is hoped that a proportion of course attendees will undertake other ART courses, and hopefully some will go on to seek full qualification as ART tutors themselves in due course.

The Education Committee will be seeking information from towers on a number of topics over the coming months. We would like to identify towers that either have particular support requirements to develop their ringing, or in some cases, recommence ringing. Please respond to survey questionnaires when they come out. We will do our best to make them as easy as possible to complete. If you have a good idea that could contribute to the educational

programme, please get in touch with me directly. We need information to ensure that the Education Committee provides the support that your tower and individual ringers needs; please help us to help you.

It is envisaged that over the coming year we will be providing courses on the development of method ringing to enable individual ringers and bands to advance and increase their repertoire. Please get in touch if you have any requests for specific courses, and we will do our best to put something in place for you. Such training courses are always in need of strong ringers to join in and ring alongside those learning a particular method. If you are keen to help in this way, please get in touch. I can be contacted via the Officers page of the Yorkshire Association website.

Also on the agenda, is how we develop the leaders of the future. We need to pay particular attention to the training and development of ringers who can lead Sunday Service ringing, and other ringing activities. Conducting is a complex skill, and I will be calling on experienced conductors to help in the delivery of training to provide the Yorkshire Association with the next generation of Tower Captains and Ringing Masters.

Finally, I may be calling upon you for help on the Education Committee. As we develop new educational offerings, I will be putting together dedicated teams for specific projects, and coopting people to the committee for a period of time. If you are keen to help, please get in touch with me.

My thanks go to members of the Education Committee for their work with me in my first few months in the Convenor role. I would like to thank Simon Plows (Secretary) and Bill Lennox (Treasurer) for their hard work. My thanks go also to Barrie Dove and Elva Ainsworth for their support and very useful thoughts on how the impact of the work of the Education Committee can be maximised. Education is key to the development and ongoing progression of change ringing in Yorkshire. Please help me to deliver a strong and sustainable environment to enable ringing and ringers to flourish.

We have had towers where we offered a grant but have now lowered the level of grant to "Support". This is where we have said we will support a project but have not given a specific grant figure. One tower with this status is:

Laughton en le Morthern: They are having work done on the tower and will be reapplying for a grant when that work is done. This will be a transferred ring of bells from outside of Yorkshire. We hope this is going to be quite soon and that they will be in a position to update us.

One thing to note: After long periods of bells not being rung the Central Council guidance is still to check your bells and make sure everything is how it should be in the belfry. It is always worth remembering ongoing maintenance can help prolong the need for expensive refurbishment work.

We are looking at various ways for finding homes for bells where they are no longer needed in their current churches. I ask members to keep me informed if they know of any churches that may be closing and bells that might be becoming available for transfer. Also, if you know of a church where towers could rehouse second-hand bells, please let me know at the earliest opportunity. We now have a list on our website of any Yorkshire bells that are available to be transferred to other towers. We have some towers in the county looking at options for bells from the Keltek Trust.

On the fundraising side of the BRF we are in the planning stages of running a lottery/100 club fundraiser. We are looking at options of how this would be managed and if anyone could help us, we would like to hear from you.

In 2022 Steve Waterworth took part in a sponsored bike ride and in October there was a quiz in aid of the BRF. Thank you to Steve, and all who helped and supported the quiz. Also, you can help raise funds by using Amazon smile and easy fundraising when you do online shopping.

Running and helping with bell projects can bring ringers together, they may be quite daunting and big commitments but normally fun. I have seen two big projects in the last year at Bubwith and Bolsterstone where a lot of the work in the tower was done by volunteer labour helping the bellhanger. This was not just ringers from those towers, but ringers from the respective areas pulling together and giving up their time to the cause. This sort of effort really helps projects no end.

Trustees are appointed every year by the General Committee. If you would be interested in becoming a Trustee, please contact me or the general secretary. As we fall within the rules set by the Charities Commission there are certain conditions which apply as to who can become a trustee.

The next two meetings of the Trustees will be held in September 2023 and February 2024 to consider applications for support and grants. The closing dates for applications are 30th June and 31st December 2023 respectively. Applications should be submitted using the YACR BRF form A and sent to the BRF Secretary: Peter McCoy. If you are considering a project, please contact me so that I can supply you with the correct form and offer any advice you may require.

For further information to allow for a full understanding of the financial affairs of the Bell Repair Fund the full annual accounts and the Trustees' annual report should be consulted. Copies of these documents are obtainable from the Association Treasurer for a reasonable fee to cover costs or alternately we have the most recent full reports available for download on the YACR website.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has donated money, supported fund raising events, time, labour, and effort to the Bell repair fund in 2022.

During the past year the Branch was considering how best it could organise itself, given the geographical area we cover. Several possible ways of re-organising have been proposed, but the one that seems to have the best chance of succeeding is to split the Branch into two self-organising groups. One would be to the East of the A1, led by Northallerton and Stokesley; and one to the West of the A1, led by Richmond and Ripon. On the West side, we also have the Wensleydale group who are already running very successful sessions and were awarded an Association of Ringing Teachers' prize for innovation at the recent AGM in Birmingham, congratulations to them all.

Ten bell practices have been held at Northallerton on several Saturdays and Ripon Cathedral have been holding 12 bell practices with invited bands, to develop 12 bell skills. It is essential that we offer advanced ringing to the Branch as many of our younger ringers will go on to ring in parts of the country where 10 and 12 bell ringing is more commonplace.

Towards the end of the year, we started to consider the challenges posed by the changes in the age demographics and the reducing importance of the Church in the population as a whole.

Along with the rest of the Exercise we will need to work out how to respond to these challenges and in particular, what impacts there might be on the YACR and our Branch in particular.

I have resigned as Chair of the Branch. As new Chair of ART, I look forward to working alongside the Branch and the Association in developing ringing and the teaching of ringing across the country and not least in Yorkshire.

BRANCH REPORT 2022

The Branch relaunched at the end of 2021 after a 40-year period of inactivity. 2022 was a year of contrasting halves. We held a number of meetings on Sunday afternoons and ringing included Spliced Surprise Major on several occasions. A trip over the Humber in July to ring around Barton was less well attended, though those who did attend enjoyed ringing at some rarer towers. No events were held in the latter part of the year and this perhaps reflects the need for a committee of people to be involved with the organising of events.

One challenge, which is perhaps unique to this area of Yorkshire, is the lack of ringable bells. To the East of Hull, in the area known as Holderness, Withernsea bells (now under the care of The Churches Conservation Trust) have been unavailable for some years, though it is hoped this might change during 2023. Burstwick church, with its fine peal of six, is facing closure and the bells are no longer available for ringing. At Patrington, a truly magnificent church, the eight bells are out of action due to corrosion in the metal frame, and attempts to begin ringing again, even on the front six, have met with resistance from the DAC Bells Advisor. Of the many lesser peals of bells in Holderness, only Long Riston (3) are available for ringing. Collectively, ringing opportunities East of Hull are half of what they could be. Congratulations are therefore in order to Helen Audley and the Roos ringers for championing young ringers and getting involved with The Yorkshire Tykes.

2023 will bring further opportunities to reinvigorate this branch, and doubtless some challenges, as the Association reviews its structure and organisation.

QUARTER PEAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

Criteria used for including quarter peals:-

I have used the same criteria as applied in previous years for collating YACR quarter peals. I have used Duco Software and included all performances submitted as quarter peals to Bellboard, attributed to the Yorkshire Association between 1st January 2022 and 31st December 2022. I have also included 3 quarter peals, during the same date parameters, which were jointly attributed to the Yorkshire Association and Beverley and District Ringing Society and the 2022 Devil's Knell Tolling at All Saints, Dewsbury on Christmas Eve. The figures listed below for leading ringers and conductors relate only to quarters attributed to the YACR, although several of those YACR members may have also conducted or rung more quarters attributed to other societies.

The Statistics:

368 quarter peals were rung in 120 different towers/locations by 466 different ringers and 98 different conductors. 26 of these quarters were on hand bells.

Quarter peal footnotes: 23 people rang their first quarter peal on tower bells during 2022, 3 rang their first quarter on hand bells and 5 people conducted their first quarter peal. Several other people ventured into ringing/conducting their first quarter peals in different methods, on inside/working bells or on a greater number of bells than they had previously rung.

Various points of interest:-

2022 brought with it many changes – for the first time in 3 years, daily life began to return to some degree of normality following the Covid Pandemic. The country saw three changes of Prime Minister and on 24th February 2022 Russia invaded Ukraine. On 2nd February, Queen Elizabeth II become the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee of 70 years on the throne and the country celebrated with a 4-day Bank Holiday weekend from Thursday 2nd June - Sunday 5th June. On the evening of 8th September, the world was advised of the death of Queen Elizabeth II, aged 96 years at Balmoral Castle. The Prince of Wales ascended to the throne on the death of his mother, to become King Charles III and the oldest person to accede to the British Throne at the age of 73. The Proclamation of King Charles III took place on 10th September at St James Palace and during 2023 we will celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III at Westminster Abbey on 6th May. Quarter peals were rung again during each month of the year - the highest number of quarter peals were rung in June (71), September (48), December (34) and February (32). These months were significantly higher than others as they signified important dates during the year to which quarter peals were dedicated in their footnotes. During 2022 a large proportion

of the quarter peals submitted to Bellboard were dedicated to HM Queen Elizabeth II. These include 65 for Platinum Jubilee Celebrations/Accession, 3 for her 96th Birthday and 32 quarter peals marked her death. 5 quarter peals were rung to celebrate the accession to the throne of His Majesty King Charles III.

Throughout the year other quarter peals were rung for Sunday services, birthdays, weddings, wedding anniversaries, memorials, christenings, evening mass, Holocaust Day, Remembrance Day, for solidarity with the people of Ukraine, Easter, Advent, Christingle

and Christmas carol services.

Other quarter peals of interest included a ring at St Martin Le Grand, York to mark the 80th Anniversary of the bombing of the church on the night of 29th April 1942. The Cathedral Church of St Peter and St Paul, Sheffield acknowledge the 40th Anniversary of the sinking of the HMS Sheffield with a quarter peal of Yorkshire Surprise Royal. St Pauls, Shipley rang their first quarter peal on the bells since at least 1938. On 4th September, St Peter, Norton on Derwent celebrated the conclusion of one of their ringers sponsored 140-mile cycle ride around the 27 towers of the Scarborough & District Branch of the YACR, in support of the YACR Bell Repair Fund. All Saints, Ilkley marked the 150th anniversary of the first recorded peal length performance there on 7th December 1872 conducted by Jasper W Snowdon. On 24th December, The Devil's Knell Tolling took place at All Saints, Dewsbury where the Black Tom 1300-weight tenor bell is tolled once for each year since Christ was born, with the final toll ending on the stroke of midnight. A local legend explains the custom of this tradition.

I trust that the criteria I have used is acceptable, accurate and relevant.

PEAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

The 2022 peal total was a significant increase on the last two years of living with a pandemic, but a long way short of typical totals for years up to 2019. It remains to be seen when and if we reach 300 a year again. Both tower bell peal and hand bell peal totals were well below pre-pandemic totals. It's notable that June was by far the heaviest month for peals, no doubt spurred on by the unique occasion of the Platinum Jubilee.

Local band peals reported in 2022 were by Leeds Minster at Hemsworth (21438) and at Evesham (21622); by Northallerton (21557); and by Selby Abbey (21560).

First peals on the bells were rung at Rufforth (21482); and on the augmented bells at Beverley St Mary (21436), Barton (21493) and Bubwith (21528), Additionally, the first for the Association was rung at Driffield (21453); and first for 48 years at Sandal Magna (21508).

Methods included 4 rung for the first time and a further 9 new to the Association. The most popular single method for peals was Bristol Surprise Major (17), followed by Yorkshire Surprise Major and Royal, both with 9.

A notable peal was rung at Wakefield Cathedral (21591) on the exact 200th anniversary of the first ever peal of Cambridge S Royal, using the same composition - possibly the oldest 'new composition' for the Association!

This saves a lot of work for both composition and peal secretaries at year end! Do just ask if you have queries about any historic YACR peals - information can be readily extracted from the database.
